statline: 36GP, 24-22-46, +16, 6PIM scouting report: One of the most complete players to enter the draft in recent memory, Matthews is a complete offensive dynamo with a vast skill set; Matthews can stick handle, pass, and most prominently shoot the puck; high hockey sense and two-way ability. nhl comparable: Jonathan Toews

The Blues do own some youth up front, such as Fabbri, Schwartz, and Barbashev, but their strength is definitely on the blue line. St. Louis is a team that is filled with defensive talent in both the present and in the future, which leads me to believe they'll likely target a winger with top 6 upside with their first selection at 28th Overall with targets such as Tage Thompson, Tyler Benson, Adam Mascherin, Pascal Laberge, Boris Katchouk, or perhaps even center German Rubtsov.


